

FIVEREASONS TO VISIT... Turkey

You like fuss-free flights
British Airways is clearly a fan of Turkey's
southern coast: it just launched new routes to
Bodrum (twice a week) and Dalaman (four

times a week) from £178 and £181 return respectively. Goodbye to cabin-bag wrangling, hello to free G&T as you zoom over the sparkling blue Aegean (0844 493 0787, ba.com/bodrum; ba.com/dalaman).

You want the greatest hits — in one trip
Got a decade of Turkey ideas stored up? Tick
off the lot in one go with an 11-night 'Ultimate
Turkey' tour, taking in Istanbul's souks and
mosques, Cappadocia's volcanic landscapes
and ancient Ephesus. Hot-air balloons and
whirling dervishes come as standard. From
£5,480pp, B&B, including domestic flights,
transfers, a cruise and entry fees; international
flights extra (corinthiantravel.co.uk).

You like to be wined and dined
Turkey's food scene is gaining momentum;
Rick Stein even headed there for his latest
series (BBC2, August). And last June saw
a new food festival: the intriguingly named
Forgotten Delicacies (kaybolanlezzetler.com;
16-17 May), where neglected Greek-, Jewishand Levantine-influenced dishes were
resurrected in the cobbled sidestreets
around Alaçatı (May 16-17 in 2015). The area's
also home to millennia-old wineries such as
Urla (urlasarapcilik.com.tr) — be sure to

You've got a shot at the first bounce on
the beds at affordable all-inclusive Sensatori
Fethiye (seven nights from £862pp, with
flights; thomson.co.uk), or boutique Mango
Hotelin rural Faralya (villamandarin.com/

stop by for a biodynamic Sauvignon Blanc.

mango; doubles from £178, half board); and try the inaugural scrub down in the Sultan's Hammam at the Jumeirah Bodrum Palace (jumeirah.com; doubles from £285, B&B), all opening July. Feeling flush? You could even nab the latter's Palace residence, with six Jacuzzi'd master bedrooms and its own pier (£13,000 a night).

That's just what they'll do on the 820km Carian Trail, an unspoilt coastal walk from Bodrum to Içmeler, which opened last summer. Don't commit to the full monty — it takes 40 days, stumbling across Roman roads, sleepy villages and hidden coves on the way. Instead, take it in easy sections with a really clued-up guide (one of the route's creators) on a seven-day taster. From £1,500pp, full board, including flights (exclusive escapes.co.uk).
